



Scholarship Deadline: 5/1

The last day to submit an application for a scholarship offered by the Ladies Guild is May 1. To be eligible to apply the individual must be a practicing Catholic woman who has been a parishioner for at least two years and has received the sacraments of Baptism, Reconciliation, Holy Eucharist, and Confirmation. The scholarship can be used by a new or returning student to attend college or a trade or vocational school. Scholarship applications may be obtained by stopping by the parish office during normal business hours, that is, Tues., 1-4 p.m., or Wed., Thurs., Fri., 9 a.m.-12 noon and 1-4 p.m.
