Kreniks Marking 60 Years of Marriage Renew Vows



Jane Moon, on behalf of City of Fallon Mayor Ken Tedford, presented to Bob and Rose Krenik, celebrating 60 years of marriage, with a proclamation designating October 5, 2017, as *Bob and Rose Krenik Day*.

Bob and Rose Krenik, united in the Sacrament of Holy Matrimony on Oct. 5, 1957, at Sacred Heart Catholic Church in Waseca, Minnesota, renewed their marriage vows before Father Antonio Quijano, Jr., and Deacon Kurt Carlson on Sat., Sept. 30, in St. Patrick Catholic Church. Following the ritual family members and friends celebrated the couple's 60th wedding anniversary at a reception in the parish hall where guests toasted the Kreniks with sparking cider and enjoyed a bounteous buffet and anniversary cake.

Bob and Rose met at a community dance in Waseca in 1956. After their marriage they stayed in Minnesota until 1962 when they moved to Marysville, California, where they oversaw the Schuler family farm and served their church and community in many ways.

Born and raised in Le Center, Minnesota, Bob ran his family's 168-acre farm after his father's illness. Upon settling in California he began his 36-year career as an employee with Yuba College's service department.

Rose, a native of Marysville, served as a secretary and, ultimately, retired after 18 years of employment with the contracting department at Beale Air Force Base located in her hometown.

In December of 2011 the Kreniks came to Fallon where they immersed themselves within the local community through their church activities at St. Patrick's (including service with the Fallon Council of the Knights of Columbus, the Ladies Guild and the Care Net Pregnancy Care Center) and their friendships.

Bob and Rose are the proud parents of six children (Robert Michael, Mark Christopher, Paul Martin, Kathleen Ann, Patrick John, and David Joseph), all of whom attended the 60th wedding anniversary, and the proud grandparents of 11 grandchildren.

According to a proclamation issued by City of Fallon Mayor Ken Tedford, who designated October 5, 2017, as *Bob and Rose Krenik Day*, "Bob and Rose have always put the needs of their loved ones and others before their own, and have become the most endeared and productive members of all of the communities in which they have lived and served."

St. Patrick's will hold informational meetings during the week of Nov. 6-10 regarding the recently announced Diocesan Capital Campaign.


The Most Reverend Randolph Calvo, Bishop of the Diocese of Reno, is requesting diocesan parishes to help with the diocese's financial concerns in order to adequately continue its services. With the campaign's kickoff set to begin Nov. 4, the diocese will mail, starting on Nov. 6, information about the campaign to all parishioners in the diocese.

Forty percent of funds collected from St. Patrick's will go toward the diocesan campaign, while the remaining 60 percent will be applied to the balance that the parish still owes on its diocesan loan for the construction of the parish hall.

Each informational meeting at St. Patrick's parish hall during the week of Nov. 6-10 will commence at 6:30 p.m. Parish staff/volunteers will soon send invitations to parishioners with a suggested day to attend. If an individual cannot attend the assigned meeting, he/she is encouraged to choose one of the other available days in which to participate.

A team of knowledgeable persons will attempt to answer any questions brought to the informational meetings.


